

The 'Langham Loop' & Wheatsheaf Inn



Distance: 6.71 km

Difficulty: Easy


Dog Friendly: Yes

Ascent/Descent: Easy (+/- 132 metres)

Toilets: At the pub only

Wildlife: Nothing of note

The 'Langham Loop' circular walking route (Google Maps)

Starting location: at The Wheatsheaf pub in Langham (satnav: LE15 7HY).

1. Facing the pub, walk right, down Burley Road. Follow the road until it comes to a sharp right turn. Here, a track continues straight on (signposted as Langham Burial Ground, see picture right).



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2. After 150 metres, you will come to some metal gates (pictured left). Go through the hand gate on the left and follow the edge of the field along to the left. Continue to follow the field edge until you come to a footbridge on the left. Cross the bridge and go right, following the stream, but this time keeping it on your right. After just a short way, you come to a field.

3. At the field edge, head towards the right hand side end of the hedge that you can see on the opposite side of the field (when we walked this route, the path was well worn). At the corner of the hedge, there is a hand gate which leads out onto a lane. Go through the gate and walk right along the lane. After around 1km, having just passed a wooded area on your right, you will come to a brideway on the left (the road curves around to the right). Take this brideway and follow it along for around 2km with views over the valley to your right (pictured right). When you emerge at arable fields, continue following the field edge along



with the hedge on your left. Cross a field boundary (pictured left) and continue on until you come to a path leading off to the left (pictured right).



crossing a small foot bridge and along the edge of a further field. At the bottom of the field, walk right for around 50 metres, you will then see another footbridge on the left. Cross the footbridge and follow the path around to the right of the field. Continue to follow the well-marked path back to the village.

4. Follow the path along the edge of a field,

5. When you reach the road, turn right and almost immediately left into Orchard Road. At the end of the road, turn right and almost immediately left onto Bridge Street. Continue to follow Bridge Street until you reach our start point, The Wheatsheaf pub.



Pub: The Wheatsheaf Inn

The Wheatsheaf is a walker and dog-friendly, country pub in the centre of Langham. It has a perfect beer garden, a wide selection of ales from numerous different breweries and has a welcoming log fire in the winter months. Most notably, the pub recently won Rutland CAMRA Spring Pub of the Year 2016 and its pies recently fought off competition from more than 100 professional bakers and butchers to be named Best Overall Small Producer at



the eighth annual British Pie Awards in Melton Mowbray. The pub's steak and ale pie won 'Best in Class' at the British Pie Awards. No small accomplishments! So, we're sure you'll agree with us... the pie and ale needs to be sampled soon! You can view their website [here](#).
